Check Your Fabric!

Be sure to regularly inspect your weed barrier fabric to protect your trees. Make sure edges are covered with dirt and staples are secure around each tree. If the fabric comes loose and covers the trees, it can block sunlight and cause them to die if left covered too long. As your trees grow, enlarge the fabric openings to prevent it from growing into the trunk.

A few quick checks can go a long way in keeping your trees healthy!



Do You Need Replacement Trees?

If you have not already ordered your handplants, please contact our office as soon as possible to check availability.

⚠ If it gets too late in the season, we cannot guarantee all tree species will be in stock.

The sooner you call, the better your chances of getting the trees you need for your shelterbelt.

Planning a new shelterbelt?

Call the office and speak with Bryan. He can assist with:

- Shelterbelt design
- Tree species selection tailored to your site
- Information on available grants (note: some may require pre-approval before planting begins)

We will do our best to help you find the right trees and make your planting a success!



Site Preparation & Renovations

Proper site preparation is essential for tree survival and efficient planting. A well-prepared site makes planting easier and greatly increases the success rate of your trees. The District reserves the right to refuse planting and retain the down payment if the site is not adequately prepared. Each site will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Additional charges may apply for poorly prepared sites or renovation work, at the discretion of the District Manager.

Tip: Maintaining a clean, weed-free site can reduce your need for replanting and save money in the long run.

Tree Planting Tips

- ≈ Plant trees on a prepared site
- ≈ Do not expose the tree roots to drying before or during planting
- ≈ Keep the roots cool and covered
- ≈ Do not plant seedlings deeper than 1" above the root collar
- ≈ Control competing vegetation between and within tree rows
- ≈ Plant only when the frost is out of the ground
- ≈ Provide a planting hole that is wider than roots so they can spread out
- ≈ Pack the soil around the seedling to eliminate air pockets
- ≈ Old or new trees & livestock never mix
- ≈ Take appropriate action against rodents and deer before they damage the trees
- ≈ Replant dead trees to maintain windbreak density
- ≈ Install a commercial weed barrier to increase survival and growth
